Democracy - A system of government that allows the people to vote in elections.

Weimar – The name of the German government following World War One.

Dictatorship – A system of rule in which one person makes all decisions.

Putsch - A sudden change in leadership. Usually violent.

Reichstag - The German version of the Parliament building.

Chancellor - The German version of Prime Minister.

Liberal - A political system that is usually accepting of change and development.

Propaganda - A form of media that is meant to make you think or feel a certain way.

Censorship - Limiting or removing information from public view. This is usually to impact opinions.

Economic - Anything involving money, trade, wages etc.

Political - Things involving leadership, laws and government.

Social - Things involving living conditions, food, housing, employment etc.

<u>Family and Community</u> – Helping us to understand the different communities that make up the world.

<u>Dignity of the Human Person</u>—The belief that, as all humans are created in God's image, all people should be treated with dignity and respect

<u>Rights and responsibility</u> – All God's people have the right to food, work, clothes, a home, school, and medical care.

What was going on in the wider world?

America was experiencing an economic boom and then an economic depression.

Britain went through a general strike, gave all women the vote, and saw the Labour party become popular. **Russia** went through a civil war and saw the leadership of both Lenin and Stalin.

World War One – We will look at how Germany's role in World War One, and how the German people were affected by the end of World War One.

The Treaty of Versailles – We will look at the clauses and impacts of the Treaty of Versailles.

Life in Weimar Germany – We will look at what life was like in Germany straight after World War One. This period of time was called Weimar Germany.

The early rise of the Nazis – We will look at the rise of the Nazis from an early group to one of the most popular in the country.

The Munich Putsch – This was Hitler's attempt to take the country over using violence.

The Reichstag Fire – We will look at the Reichstag Fire and how it helped Hitler take more power.

Night of the Long Knives – We look at how this event helped Hitler to eliminate threats to his power in the 1930s
